Vaccination Policy for Hepatitis B

1. Purpose

To protect medical students, faculty, and healthcare personnel from vaccine-preventable diseases, particularly those acquired through occupational exposure, such as Hepatitis B.

2. Scope

This policy applies to:

All undergraduate and postgraduate students

Faculty members and clinical instructors

Laboratory and clinical staff

Any individual participating in clinical or laboratory work involving patient contact or biological material.

3. Policy Statement

All individuals covered under this policy must be fully immunized against specified infectious diseases prior to clinical exposure. Documentation of immunization is a condition for participation in hospital postings, patient care, and laboratory work.

4. Hepatitis B Vaccination Protocol

Who must receive it: All students and staff with potential exposure to blood or bodily fluids.

Vaccination schedule: 3 doses (0, 1, and 6 months).

Post-vaccination testing: Anti-HBs titer testing 1–2 months after final dose.

If titer ≥ 10 mIU/mL: Considered protected.

If titer < 10 mIU/mL: Revaccination series required.

Non-responders: Should be evaluated and counselled for protection measures.

5. Record Keeping

All students and staff must submit proof of vaccination at the time of admission or hiring.

Vaccination records shall be maintained by the Student Health Office or Medical Education Unit

Annual audits will be conducted to ensure compliance.

6. Exemptions

Exemptions may be granted only for:

Documented medical contraindications (e.g., severe allergic reaction)

Temporary deferments (e.g., pregnancy or illness)

All exemptions require approval from the College Health Committee.

7. Non-Compliance

Students not compliant with this policy may be restricted from clinical rotations or suspended from certain academic activities.

Staff may face administrative action including restricted patient contact.

8. Oversight

The policy is overseen by the Infection Control Committee and Student Health Services.

Updates will be made annually in line with national and international health guidelines (e.g., CDC, WHO, local Ministry of Health).
