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# Policy on Promoting a Student-Centered Learning Approach and Reflective practice

## 1. Purpose

To foster a student-centered learning environment that empowers students to take actives ownership of their learning, engage in self-directed study, and cultivate the habits of reflective practice to improve performance and professional growth.

## 2. Scope

This policy applies to all undergraduate MBBS student and teaching faculty at Queens Medical College, including curriculum developers and modules coordinators.

## 3. Policy Statement

Queens Medical College is committed to a student-centered educational philosophy that positions the leaner at the core of the teaching and learning process. The institution encourages self-directed learning, critical reflection, and the development of lifelong learning habits as essential competencies of future healthcare professionals.

# 4. Objectives

- To promote actives participation and autonomy in the student learning process.
- To facilitate the development of self-directed learning (SDL) and time management skills.
- To incorporate structured opportunities for students to reflect on their academic and clinical experience.
- To create an academic culture that values dialogue, curiosity, and collaboration.

## 5. Implementation Strategies

#### 5.1 Curriculum Design

- Embed students-centered strategies such as problem-based learning (PBL), team-based learning (TBL), case-based discussions, and clinical simulations across all years.
- Allocate protected time for self-directed learning in the time table.

# **5.2 Faculty Training**

- Train faculty to adopt facilitative roles, guiding students to explore, inquire, and engage critically.
- Use techniques like open-ended questioning, feedback loops, and flipped classroom.

# 5.3 Support for SDL

- Provide students with structured guidance on goal-setting, resources identification, time management, and self-assessment.
- Use learning contracts and personal learning plans in clinical years.

# **5.4 Reflective Practice integration**

- Introduce reflective writing, portfolios, and debriefing sessions post clinical encounters or simulations.
- Encourage reflections as a tool for professional identity formation and continuous improvement.

#### 5.5 Feedback and Mentorship

- Incorporate regular formative feedback mechanism into all learning activities.
- Assign faculty mentors to support students academic and personal development.
